

Block of the Month — April



Time does fly and here is the second block for your patriotic quilt! April's block of the month is an easy one. The "Two Patch Quilt" pattern is found on page 54 at http://quilterscache.com. If you are using the patriotic color theme, color 1 is blue and color 2 is white. If you want a more coordinated quilt, use the

same blue on the star points that you used in the March Block. Using different blues will give your quilt a "scrappy look."

Color 1 is red, color 2 is medium blue, color 3 is a darker blue (several shades darker than color 2), and color 4 is white.

Ima Quilter—Did You Know?

Spring is here!

Did You Know – that when you are putting together the back for a quilt that



will be going to a longarmer to place your seam horizontally to the quilt top. This will keep the back more even during quilting and not distort the backing fabric with waves. This makes for a much nicer finished look for your quilt.

Did You Know – that needle on your sewing machine is probably ready to retire. It is a good idea to replace your needle every 6-8 hours of sewing.

Choose the right needle for your fabric type: universal needles for general sewing, stretch needles for stretchy fabrics, Microtex needles for delicate fabrics, and jeans needles for tough denims.

Regularly changing your sewing machine needle can prevent thread breaking or knotting, reduce skipped stitches, and improve fabric handling, ultimately extending the life of your sewing machine.

Be attentive to signs of needle wear such as irregular stitching, bent or rusty needles, and ensure needles are lubricated and stored safely when not in use.

May we all be as sharp as our needles.

Livingston Piecemakers Quilt Guild will present their Quilt Show called Quilting Among Friends **Friday, April 4**th **and Saturday, April 5**th from 10am to 4pm. They will display more than 100 quilts and raffle off a Baby Lock Jazz 2 sewing machine.

Piney Woods Quilt Festival takes place in Carthage, TX, Friday, April 11 from 9am to 4pm, and Saturday, April 12 from 9am to 4pm. It's north of Nacogdoches and is about a three-hour drive.

The last weekend of April, (April 25-26) there are three Quilt Shows in Texas. The closest one to us is the one in Gun Barrel City, TX, an annual quilt show hosted by the **Gun Barrel Quilters Guild.** Their theme this year is Cotton Candy, and it will be a judged show with more than 100 quilts, as well as vendors and a Country Store. Three and a half hour drive.

The second closest one is the **Highland Lakes Quilt Guild**. That guild will hold a Festival & 25th Silver Anniversary Celebration at the Burnet Community Center in Burnet, TX, northwest of Austin. Just under four hours from Kingwood.

The one furthest away is in Brownwood, TX, about a five-hour drive. The **Brownwood Quilt Show** highlights antique quilts, miniature quilts and bed turning as well as special exhibits and vendors.

Advertising rates are researched by the Newsletter Chairman and any proposed rate changes will be submitted to the KAQG Board by the July Board meeting. Once approved by the Board, the Newsletter Chairman will use the approved rates when sending letters to potential advertisers for the upcoming fiscal year. (Example Sept. 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025). Rates are pro-rated for a minimum of a quarter year.

Occasionally, members want to sell sewing items such as a sewing machine. The cost to advertise a sewing item in the newsletter is \$5.00 per month. If a non-member requests to advertise a sewing item, it is \$10.00 per month. The request must be in writing to the Communication Director and President. The request must be approved by the President, copying the Communications Director, Newsletter Editor and Treasurer.

This document is maintained by the Newsletter Chairman and a copy is provided to the Treasurer. The Treasurer will inform the Newsletter Chairman when checks are received from advertisers and ensures the paid amount matches the rates/advert size requested by the advertiser.
