

August 2009 Show and Tell

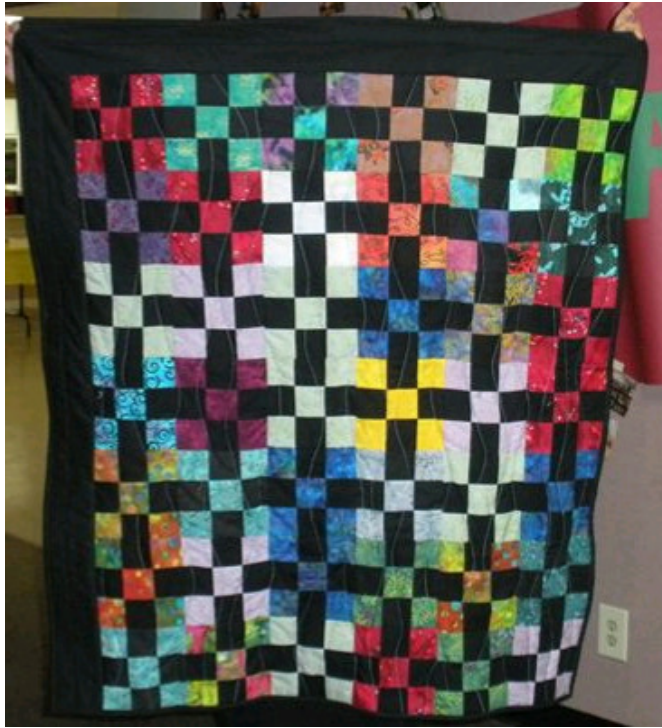
