assembled the top. Lish said "If you've never tried the One-Block Wonder technique, you should! This is so much fun!"



Jerri Dudley and the Spring Chickens presented their quilt which they call Happy Hens. It was quilted by Diane Klegsted. Jerri said that they came to their Bee with their scraps and Seam to Steam. They shared fabric and this is what they came up with. It was fun and each member did something. This is being donated for the Guild Auction in April.



Edna Taylor presented a Mariner's Compass pillow. She had promised her husband that she would make him something for his media room, so she took a class and made two pillows using this pattern. He picked the fabrics all by himself from It's A Stitch because she couldn't get home from work before the store closed. The class was a paper-piecing class at Painted Pony Quilts.



Jan Thompson presented her quilt which she named Sweet Dreams, Sandra. Her sister picked the fabrics from Jan's stash when she visited last July. She's coming back next Thursday (3/13) and she finished the binding today (3/6). She sewed the label on during the meeting. The pattern is called "Mutt & Jeff" by Joan Lash of Quilt Country.



Margaret Erickson presented her quilt which she named Fuschia Hearts. She made this quilt for her son's girlfriend for her 21<sup>st</sup> birthday. It is made up of 3-1/2" squares, 16 squares to a block. There are 48 blocks in the quilt for a total of 768 3-1/2" squares. It was a lot of cutting. The pattern is called Ribbon Hearts by Mischele Hart.



Martha Goettee presented her quilt which she named Oriental Ladies. The Oriental Ladies picture is in the center with fans around them. This is Martha's first quilt, and she designed it herself.



This quilt is called Tropical Friendship Star. The maker saw the blue border fabric and instantly thought of her best friend, who loves blue and bright colors! She got enough fabric to make this pattern for both of them. Her friend just moved to Belgium, so she will be sending it across the ocean. The pattern is a Friendship Star by Alex Anderson.



This is a Plain and Simple Runner. The maker saw the Moda charm pack that makes up the center blocks and loved it. She thinks charms are so much fun and so many options are out there. The pattern is called Classic Runners #12 by the Little Quilt Company.



Paula Byrd presented her quilt which she named Asian Delight, quilted by Margo Pieper. Paula designed the quilt using two books by Judy Hopkins – Around the Block with Judy Hopkins and Around the Block Again. This is being donated for the Guild Auction in April.



Rebecca Ward presented a 9-patch and snowball baby quilt which was made by Bee Charitable and Kirbee for Rebecca's daughter Shannon who had a son in October. He is almost 5 months old now. The quilt, which was quilted by Janetta Rodriguez, is backed with fuzzy fleece.

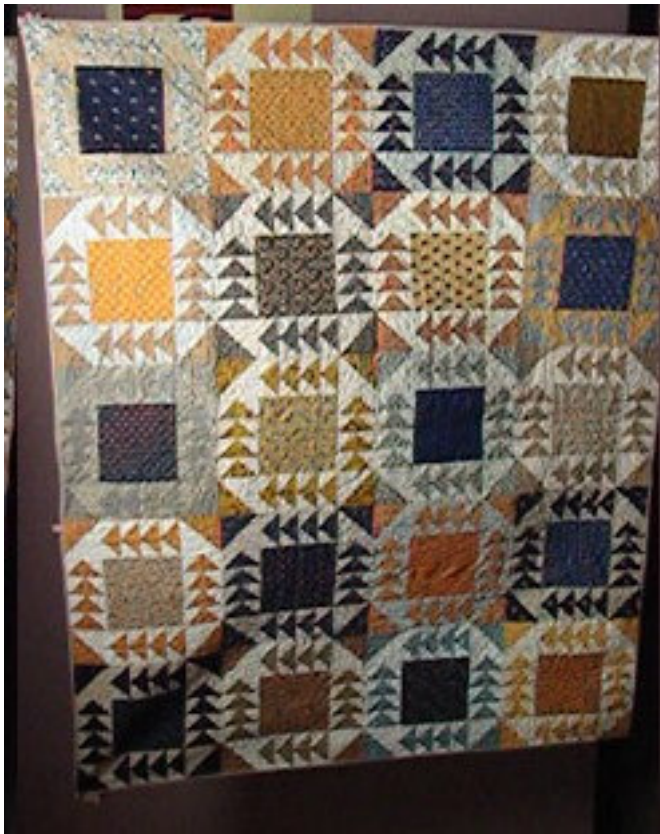
